Philosophy

It is the aim of the East Whittier City School District to provide students with the knowledge of those academic skills and concepts, which they must learn and apply to function effectively in our society.

The East Whittier City School District in partnership with parents endeavors to motivate, inspire, and encourage all students to use their unique potentials to reach their highest level of academic achievement and emotional and physical wellbeing.

Goals

- All students will reach high academic standards, attaining proficiency or better in reading, writing and mathematics.
- English Learners will become proficient in English and reach high academic standards attaining proficiency or better in reading, writing and mathematics.
- All students will be educated in learning environments that are safe, drug-free and conducive to learning. School staff members will form influential relationships with students and will focus on building assets in them that will help them grow into capable, responsible and healthy young people.
- All students will be taught by highly qualified teachers. No Child Left Behind defines a highly qualified teacher
 as someone who has: 1) a bachelor's degree, 2) full state certification, and 3) demonstrated subject matter
 competency.

Arts Education Vision Statement

In 2008 the East Whittier City School District developed an arts education strategic plan. In 2016 the district decided to update the vision and develop new actions for the future. The district envisions that by 2019 its arts education program will include:

- Relevant, experiential, and standards based TK-8 Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) curriculum
