Alex Johnson was appointed to the LA County Board of Education in 2014. He is managing director for California for Safety and Justice, a nonprofit that aims to stop the cycle of crime and build healthy communities. Previously, Mr. Johnson served as executive director for the Children's Defense Fund-California, and as assistant deputy for Education and Public Safety to Los Angeles County Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas. He serves on the California Racial and Identity Profiling Advisory Board, the Board of Directors for the Arts for Incarcerated Youth Network, the National Advisory Committee for the Creative Youth Development National Partnership and the Wiley Center for Speech and Language Development. Mr. Johnson is a graduate of Morehouse College and earned his Juris Doctor from American University, Washington College of Law.
